- helps protect against tetanus, diphtheria, polio and meningitis. The Td/IPV vaccine is a booster vaccine. Students need a total of 5 doses of tetanus, diphtheria and polio vaccines to build up and keep your immunity. They will have had the first 3 doses as a baby, dose 4 between the ages of 3 and 5 years old (pre-school booster) and dose 5 is due in Year 9 (aged 13/14). A consent form from HCRG has been sent to parents, and reminder will be sent out in due course.
- On Friday 20th June our Year 11 DofE students will head off on their Bronze expedition, this is the first expedition we have run through the school and we are very excited to hear how they get on.
- Thursday 26th June will be our Year 11 Prom, once again being held at the beautiful Chalk Barn in Rushall.
