Maths is taught in a small group of 9 students in order to narrow the GAP

English- All students have a guided literacy lesson once a week to support basic literacy skills.

5 Students have literacy intervention 1 x per week following the corrective reading programme (2 students attend separately there needs are greater than that of the group) 1 student with an EHCP has 1-1 support for literacy.

9 students have Maths intervention 1 x per week, they are split into two groups.

7 Students have literacy intervention 1 x per week following the corrective reading programme (2 students with EHCP plans will not attend)

5 students have Maths intervention (1 student refuses to attend)

Tracking Data for year 8:

English

- 6 students (86%) of those attending intervention made progress in reading accuracy and reading for understanding in the academic year 2017/2018
- Those 6 still remain outside of an average confidence band, and so the intervention is continuing.

Maths

- 4 students (80%) were on track in Maths and working at expectation.
- 1 student (20%) is making progress but attainment is not where we would like it to be.
