EVENTS COMING UP

- On Wednesday 11th June our SEN department is taking a group of students to Longleat Safari Park for the day.
- Our Year 7 Parent's Evening will take place on Thursday 12th June. This will be held in school between 4pm and 7pm and booking details will be sent out closer to the date.
- Tuesday 17th June we have the school immunisation team in for Year 9 Td/IPV and Meningitis vaccine which helps protect against tetanus, diphtheria, polio and meningitis. The Td/IPV vaccine is a booster vaccinne. You need a total of 5 doses of tetanus, diphtheria and polio vaccines to build up and keep your immunity. You should have had the first 3 doses as a baby, dose 4 when you were between 3 and 5 years old (pre-school booster) and dose 5 is due in Year 9 (aged 13/14). A consent form from HCRG has been sent to parents, and reminder will be sent out in due course.
- On Friday 20th June our Year 11 DofE students will head off on their Bronze expedition, this is the first expedition we have run through the school and we are very excited to hear how they get on.
- Thursday 26th June will be our Year 11 Prom, once being held again at the beautiful Chalk Barn in Rushall.

Young cooks aged 11-16 are invited to send their recipe for a main course dish, using principally locallyproduced ingredients. Selected entrants will be asked to prepare their dish for judges in a final in their own county initially, and each of the county winners will then meet at the overall South West final.

The Wiltshire county final will be held on Thursday 19th June at Wiltshire College, Trowbridge, at 2.45pm, when competitors will be given 90 minutes to prepare two portions of their dish.

Before meeting at the grand final, all county winners will be offered mentoring with one of our esteemed judges, to help them to prepare and elevate their dish for the final in October. The mentoring process also provides finalists with an opportunity to further develop their skills and gain valuable experience of a commercial kitchen.
