

Eco-Week

The Wiltshire Youth Council have come up with an event for schools across the county to participate in to help promote positive changes regarding climate change. This event has been called Eco Week and will be taking place from 6th -10th March 2023. During the week, participating schools can come up with a range of activities that contribute to the promotion of those positive changes that we need to make, to combat climate change. Our Student Leadership Team and Navigators have come up with a number of great activities for the school to participate in during the week:

• Students are encouraged (where possible) to walk or cycle in to school during the week. They will log their mileage during tutor time each day, giving us a grand total by the end of the week. Lets see how many miles we can total and what the equivalent carbon offset would be.

• Litter picking week. Students can sign up to a rota of litter picking at breaktime and lunch time during the week. Any recyclable items can then be re-purposed in the Art department.

• 'Green Day' on Wednesday the 8th March students will be allowed to come in to school wearing items which are either green in colour or 'green' in that they have been re-purposed, second-hand or handmade.

• A gardening club will be starting up, this will have its inaugural meet on Friday lunchtime. The club will be planting tomato seeds and making Bee Bombs and many other sustainable forms of planting.

• The Art department and Creative Navigators will be organising a FREE workshop after school on Friday 10th March for all students and staff to make environmentally creative crafts out of plastic bottles. So we are asking all students to bring in clean plastic bottles for this event, which can be dropped off to the art room by Thursday 9th March.

All these activities will be shared on social media, along with other schools, using the hashtag #wycecoweek. Wiltshire Youth Council will be judging all the activities

throughout the week and there will be a prize for both first and second place schools. We look forward to participating in this event.


